evidence is similarly abundant that a great many Americans long before the Revolution thoroughly detested British rule on precisely the issue of Britain's refusal to permit any real development of the continent. In the colonists' minds Britain's oppression was underscored by its open collusion with France to destroy colonial attempts to develop the interior. Westward colonization efforts from New England to the Carolinas were instant targets for Indian massacres typically directed by French Jesuit missionaries operating from Canada or on the southern flank from French outposts in Louisiana. American efforts to remove such threats through appeals to the monarchy for assistance or by military measures of their own were repeatedly betrayed by Britain's ruling circles. These political facts of life were known to generations of Americans before the Revolution.
