

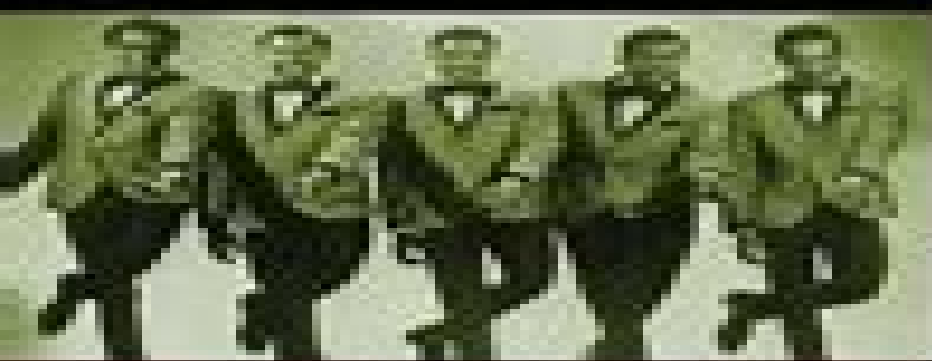

countless radio and television appearances Swing It is the first published biography of this incredibly popular trio The book includes many rarely published photos and features extensive career data including a detailed discography filmography and listing of their radio and television appearances between 1938 and 1967 The Andrews Sisters had their big break with the 1937 release of the Yiddish tune Bei Mir Bist Du Schon Means that You re Grand which sold 350 000 copies in one month and established the trio as successful recording artists The sisters are now probably best remembered for their work entertaining troops in World War II They traveled across the U S and to Italy and Africa and their recording of Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy for the film Buck Privates became synonymous with the war effort Part of the reason for the success of the Andrews Sisters was their ability to perform so many different types of music They repeatedly achieved major hits with melodies derived from many different countries becoming the first and most prominent artists of their time to bring ethnic influenced music to the forefront of America s hit parade The Andrews Sisters separated for two years in the 1950s as the strain of constantly living working and playing together for over four decades took its toll They reunited in 1956 and continued to perform together until LaVerne s death from cancer in 1967 The Andrews Sisters remain the most successful and enduring female vocal group in the history of show business Theirs are the voices that defined an era **P.S. I Love You** Carlton Jackson,2007-03-16 In 1953 the same year that Elvis Presley cut his first demo Cash Box magazine named the Hilltoppers the top vocal group of the year Hits such as Trying and P S I Love You raced up the charts and kept the group in Billboard s Top 40 The four fresh faced singers appeared on The Toast of the Town with Ed Sullivan who introduced them to the nation On weekends the Hilltoppers performed in cities across the country but on Monday mornings they were better known as Western Kentucky State College students Jimmy Sacca Seymour Spiegelman Don McGuire and Billy Vaughn The Korean War military drafts and changing public tastes in music however cut short singing careers that should have lasted much longer Sacca was drafted in 1953 mere months before the end of the war Vaughn left the group shortly after that for a career at Dot Records and found fame elsewhere with his orchestra McGuire and Spiegelman were drafted as well and despite a set of temporary replacement members the group eventually called it quits Fifty years later historian Carlton Jackson revisits the Kentucky college kids who made it big between classes He follows the group from their first hit recorded in Western s Van Meter Auditorium to their brief 1970s reunion Their story recalls the nature of celebrity and youth in the early days of rock n roll *Leaders of the Pack* Sean MacLeod,2015-09-03 In *Leaders of the Pack* Girl Groups of the 1960s and their Influence on Popular Culture musician and music historian Sean MacLeod surveys the hundreds of girl groups that appeared not only in the United States but also in Great Britain during the early 1960s This study corrects the neglect of their critical contribution of popular music history by exploring the social and political climate from which the girl groups emerged and their effect in turn on local and national music and culture MacLeod organizes his argument around seven leading girl groups The Shirelles The Crystals The Ronettes The Marvelettes The Vandellas the Supremes and The Shangri Las These seven sister groups serve as the basis for

Class Act Cholly Atkins, Jacqui Malone, 2003-04-09 Cholly Atkins s career has spanned an extraordinary era of American dance He began performing during Prohibition and continued his apprenticeship in vaudeville in nightclubs and in the army during World War II With his partner Honi Coles Cholly toured the country performing with such jazz masters as Louis Armstrong Cab Calloway and Count Basie As tap reached a nadir in the fifties Cholly created the new specialization of vocal choreography teaching rhythm and blues singers how to perform their music by adding rhythmical dance steps drawn from twentieth century American dance from the Charleston to rhythm tap For the burgeoning Motown record label Cholly taught such artists as the Supremes Smokey Robinson and the Miracles the Temptations Gladys Knight and the Pips and Marvin Gaye to command the stage in ways that would enhance their performances and sell their songs Class Act tells of Cholly s boyhood and coming of age his entry into the dance world of New York City his performing triumphs and personal tragedies and the career transformations that won him gold records and a Tony for choreographing Black and Blue on Broadway Chronicling the rise near demise and rediscovery of tap dancing the book is both an engaging biography and a rich cultural history
