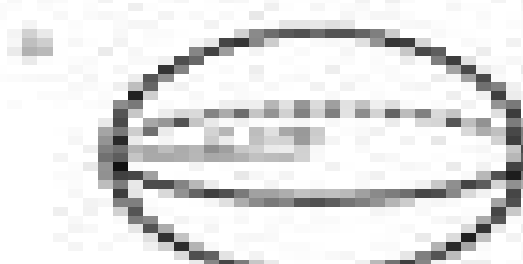

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web the magnetic pole is currently in the far north of canada and has been for there approximately for 200 year this all means that is you are sitting in the uk a magnetic compass points approxima tely 3 5 degrees to the west of true north this difference is known a variation variation is relatively predictable and is marked on the chart

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if they re west and subtract east and from compass to true do the opposite subtract west and add east

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web magnetic declination sometimes called magnetic variation is the angle between magnetic north and true north

declination is positive east of true north and negative when west magnetic declination changes over time and with location as
the compass points with local magnetic fields declination value is needed to obtain true north more

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web around uk coasts variation is around 4 west to 7 west in other parts of the world it can reach more than 50 east or west
because the magnetic north pole moves the variation changes from year to year the compass rose on the chart gives the
annual change around 7 east per year around the uk

either east or west east declination is considered positive and west is negative charts or maps define the
