At the End of Life Lee Gutkind, 2012-04-10 What should medicine do when it can't save your life? The modern healthcare system has become proficient at staving off death with aggressive interventions. And yet eventually everyone dies, and although most Americans say they would prefer to die peacefully at home, more than half of all deaths take place in hospitals or health care facilities. *At the End of Life*, the latest collaborative book project between the Creative Nonfiction Foundation and the Jewish Healthcare Foundation, tackles this conundrum head-on.
