specific cultural oriented approach that maintains the cultural context of American literary works including the historical cultural religious geopolitical and gender based elements during the literary translation into the Arabic culture I start with discussing the internationalization of American works and the importance of a cultural reading of these works Reviewing many translations of English and American works in general I categorize the challenges of cross cultural literary translation from English into Arabic into the following cultural religious geopolitical and gender based ones While I am not calling for accurate cross cultural literary translations since it is impossible however I am advocating for faithful translations which maintain the literary text's cultural and historical contexts.
