Meyer, 2009-10-13 As a governor of the Federal Reserve Board from 1996 to 2002 Laurence H Meyer helped make the economic policies that steered the United States through some of the wildest and most tumultuous times in its recent history Now in *A Term at the Fed* Governor Meyer provides an insider's view of the Fed the decisions that affected both the U S and world economies and the challenges inherent in using monetary policy to guide the economy When Governor Meyer was appointed by President Clinton to serve on the Federal Reserve Board of Governors in 1996 the United States was entering one of the most prosperous periods in its history It was the time of irrational exuberance and the fabled New Economy Soon however the economy was tested by the Asian financial crisis the Russian default and devaluation the collapse of Long Term Capital Management the bursting of America's stock bubble and the terrorist attacks of 9 11 In what amounts to a definitive playbook of monetary policy Meyer now relives the Fed's closed door debates debates that questioned how monetary policy should adapt to the possibility of a New Economy how the Fed should respond to soaring equity prices and whether the Fed should broker the controversial private sector bailout of LTCM among other issues Meyer deftly weaves these issues with firsthand stories about the personalities involved from Fed Chairman Alan Greenspan to the various staffers governors politicians and reporters that populate the world of the Fed Since the end of his term Meyer has continued to watch the Fed and the world economy He believes that we are witnessing a repetition of some of the events of the remarkable 1990s including a further acceleration in productivity and perhaps another bull market History does not repeat itself yet Meyer shows us how the lessons learned yesterday may help the Fed shape policy today

Auerbach, 2009-06-03 The Federal Reserve the central bank of the United States is the most powerful peacetime bureaucracy in the federal government Under the chairmanship of Alan Greenspan 1987-2006 the Fed achieved near mythical status for its part in managing the economy and Greenspan was lauded as a genius Few seemed to notice or care that Fed officials operated secretly with almost no public accountability There was a courageous exception to this lack of oversight however Henry B Gonzalez D TX chairman of the U S House of Representatives Financial Services banking Committee In Deception and Abuse at the Fed Robert Auerbach a former banking committee investigator recounts major instances of Fed mismanagement and abuse of power that were exposed by Rep Gonzalez including Blocking Congress and the public from holding powerful Fed officials accountable by falsely declaring for 17 years it had no transcripts of its meetings Manipulating the stock and bond markets in 1994 under cover of a preemptive strike against inflation Allowing 5.5 billion to be sent to Saddam Hussein from a small Atlanta branch of a foreign bank the result of faulty bank examination practices by the Fed Stonewalling Congressional investigations and misleading the Washington Post about the 6300 found on the Watergate burglars Auerbach provides documentation of these and other abuses at the Fed which confirms Rep Gonzalez's belief that no government agency should be allowed to operate with the secrecy and independence in which the Federal Reserve has shrouded itself Auerbach concludes with recommendations for specific broad ranging reforms that will make the Fed accountable to the government and the people of the United States

Presidential Control over Administration Patrick O'Brien, 2022-04-27 The US Constitution recognizes the president as the sole legal head of the executive branch. Despite this constitutional authority, the president's actual control over administration varies significantly in practice from one president to the next. *Presidential Control over Administration* provides a new approach for studying the presidency and policymaking that centers on this critical and often overlooked historical variable.
